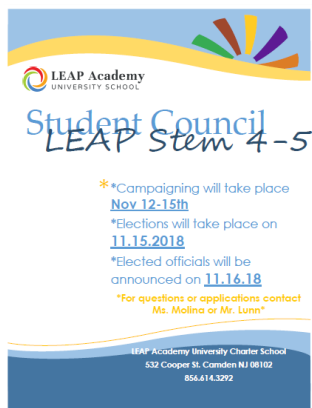


Franklin Institute Trip
